Saucy Pasta Skillet with Ricotta & Romaine Salad



20-30min 2 Servings



Today (and, really all days) we're channeling one of our favorites, Whitney Houston. Because, this saucy one-pan pasta makes us "want to dance with somebody." Each spoonful of orecchiette is coated in the ideal ratio of rich tomato sauce to gooey Parmesan and ricotta—because much like the queen of pop, we think you deserve double the cheese for Higher The Love. We've got you covered!

WHAT WE SEND

- ½ lb orecchiette pasta 3
- garlic (use 1 large clove)
- ¾ oz piece Parmesan ²
- 1 container ricotta ²
- · 2 cans tomato sauce
- 1 romaine heart
- 1 carrot

WHAT YOU NEED

- kosher salt & ground pepper
- egg¹
- · olive oil
- butter²
- white wine vinegar (or red wine vinegar)

TOOLS

- large saucepan
- colander
- box grater or microplane
- medium ovenproof skillet

1. Cook pasta

Bring a large saucepan of salted water to a boil. Add pasta and cook, stirring occasionally to prevent sticking, until al dente, 9–11 minutes. Reserve ½ cup cooking water, then drain and return pasta to pot.



2. Prep ingredients

Meanwhile, preheat broiler with top rack 6 inches from heat source. Peel and finely chop 1 teaspoon garlic. Coarsely grate Parmesan on the large holes of a box grater. Beat 1 large egg in a medium bowl. Add ricotta and half of the Parmesan, stirring to combine; season with salt and pepper.



3. Cook squce

Heat 1 tablespoon oil in a medium ovenproof skillet over medium-high. Add chopped garlic; cook until fragrant, about 30 seconds. Add all of the tomato sauce, reserved cooking water, and 2 tablespoons butter; season with salt and pepper. Reduce heat to medium-low and cook until slightly reduced and thickened (you should have about 2 cups), 2–3 minutes.



4. Assemble & bake

Add **pasta** to skillet with **sauce**, stirring to coat. Spread **ricotta mixture** in a thin layer over top (it won't cover completely). Broil on top oven rack until cheese is cooked through and browned in spots, 2–4 minutes (watch closely as broilers vary). Let sit 5 minutes (sauce will continue to thicken).



5. Make salad & serve

Cut romaine crosswise into 1-inch pieces, discarding end. Thinly slice carrot crosswise on an angle. In a large bowl, whisk 1 tablespoon oil and 1 tablespoon vinegar; season with salt and pepper. Add romaine and carrot; toss to combine. Sprinkle remaining Parmesan over top. Serve skillet pasta with romaine salad alongside. Enjoy!



6. Just add vino!

Add a splash of dry red wine to your red sauce in step 3 for an extra depth of flavor and a complexity. And, while the bottle is open—you might as well pour yourself a glass.
