Oven-Fried Taquitos with Readymade Chicken

Enchilada Sauce & Crema





Dinner needs to be on the table ASAP. Do you A) Order take-out for the umpteenth time? Or B) Make these chicken taquitos? Personally, we'd choose B. This dish requires absolutely no prepwork—just stir the filling together, bake it in tortillas, and serve with enchilada sauce and crema. So put your knife away and enjoy your Dinnerly without the stress or mess! We've got you covered!

WHAT WE SEND

- ½ lb pkg ready to heat chicken
- ¼ oz taco seasoning
- 2 oz shredded cheddarjack blend ¹
- 4 oz green enchilada sauce
- 6 (6-inch) flour tortillas 2,3
- 1 oz sour cream 1

WHAT YOU NEED

- neutral oil
- kosher salt & ground pepper

TOOLS

· rimmed baking sheet

1. CHICKEN VARIATION

Preheat oven to 425°F with a rack in the upper third. Lightly oil a rimmed baking sheet.

In a medium bowl, break up **chicken** into small pieces. Stir in **taco seasoning**, **cheese**, and **half of the enchilada sauce**. Season with **salt** and **pepper**.



2. Assemble & bake taquitos

Place **tortillas** on a clean work surface. Evenly divide **filling** among one half of each tortilla; spread into 4x1-inch rectangles. Starting at the filled side, roll up tightly. Place seam-side down on prepared baking sheet. Generously brush tops and sides with **oil**.

Bake on upper oven rack until goldenbrown and crisp, 15–20 minutes (watch closely as ovens vary).



3. Make crema & serve

Add sour cream to a small bowl. Add 1 teaspoon water at a time, as needed, to reach desired consistency. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

Serve shredded chicken taquitos with remaining enchilada sauce and crema drizzled over top. Enjoy!
